OVERDOSE SURVIVOR RESOURCES

Overdoses take a toll not only on survivors, but also on their loved ones. For each fatal overdose, there are many more non-fatal overdoses, each with emotional consequences for survivors and their loved ones. This epidemic does not distinguish among age, sex, state, or county lines.¹

Here are some resources for loved ones of people who have experienced overdoses.

FAST FACTS



Research shows that people who have had at least one overdose are more likely to have another.²



Patients are dealing with the emotional consequences of overdosing, including embarrassment, guilt, anger, and gratitude, all accompanied by the discomfort of opioid withdrawal.³



Opioid overdoses are almost always an accident. Moreover, the underlying problem that led to opioid use still exists and continues to require attention.³



Family members often feel judged because they could not prevent the overdose.
