## DRUG AND ALCOHOL CASE MANAGEMENT

Case management can help promote quality care and improve health outcomes. Case management is **a patient-centered process** that supports the individual to reach optimal health and wellness. It involves assessing the patient's needs, **collaboratively** developing a care plan, **coordinating care** and services, **advocating** for the patient, providing resources, and **following up** with the patient throughout care.<sup>1</sup>

## WHAT CASE MANAGERS DO



Links clients with community resources



Provides clients with a single point of contact



Completes a level of care assessment



Assists clients in transitioning from one level of care to the next




Addresses barriers to care that a client may experience



Works collaboratively with other service providers to ensure client needs are met

## WHY CASE MANAGEMENT IS HELPFUL

Substance use services are often fragmented and lack coordination. Clinical studies show that **return to use rates** following residential treatment **can range from 37% to 56%**, and only about **50%** of **individuals contact outpatient services after discharge**.<sup>2</sup> Case managers support the transition from inpatient to outpatient care and help **increase contact and engagement** with outpatient services to **reduce the likelihood of a return to use**. **Case managers help connect patients to community services** that can facilitate the transition from inpatient to outpatient care and support the patient's engagement in care.<sup>2,3</sup>



Case managers should also understand the barriers to treatment that underserved populations in their community face, including historical context and environmental factors, to impact health outcomes significantly.<sup>4</sup>

## SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH AND CASE MANAGMENT

Social determinants of health (SDOH) are the environmental conditions where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health risks, functioning, quality of life, and health outcomes.<sup>5</sup> SDOH impacts substance use, initiation/retention in care, and treatment outcomes. Case managers can help mitigate the impact on patients by coordinating care and helping patients access services and/or resources, as illustrated in the following graphic.<sup>6</sup>



Data from case management services can also inform policy decisions at the local, state, and national levels.<sup>6</sup> The Case Management Society of America has identified **key legislative priorities** including: **Telehealth**, **Mental Health Services**, **and Workforce Development**<sup>8</sup>. These decisions can impact the availability of substance use and SDOH services in the community. **Given the overall impact that case management can provide it is imperative to connect patients with these services.**
